ACCESSING CREDIT, GRANTS AND FUNDING

FOR A PROJECT EVEREST INTERNSHIP



Every semester, universities battle to cater to the growing industry demand for career-ready graduates. As a result, more and more career-ready and work-integrated learning components, professional practice placements, and interdisciplinary subjects are more accessible than ever.

As a UNSW student, there are a number of credit, grant and funding opportunities available to you if you undertake a project with Project Everest Ventures.

CREDIT AVAILABLE

The following UNSW courses already recognise a Project Everest Internship as an approved subject equivalent or component. Other course credit may be sought on a case-by-case basis with your subject convenor.

FUNDING AVAILABLE

OS-HELP is a loan available to eligible students enrolled in a Commonwealth Supported Place who want to undertake some of their study overseas. OS-HELP can be used for a range of expenses such as airfares, accommodation and other travel or study expenses. Students may receive one loan per six month study period and can access a total of two OS-HELP loans over their lifetime.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

All credit, grants and funding is accessed through your university, not through Project Everest Ventures. You will be required to show proof of acceptance into a Project Everest Internship prior to receiving any subsidies or credit recognition.

Applying for Course Credit

UNSW students apply for credit earned on a non-exchange basis as 'Cross Institutional Study'. To apply to have your Cross-Institutional Study request approved by following the below steps:

1. Download the [Cross Institutional Study Application form](#).
2. Fill in the form with all of the courses you may possibly complete at an overseas institution and their UNSW equivalents (listed in the table above, or you may seek further credit for subjects on a case-by-case basis).

3. Take the completed form to your [Faculty's student centre](#) for signature by a student advisor.
4. Make a copy of the signed form and keep it in a safe place.
5. When you return from your overseas course, take in your official transcript and the signed form to your Faculty student centre.
6. Your overseas credit should be transferred within five weeks. Check your [academic statement at myUNSW](#) to make sure it is updated.

Applying for OS-HELP

1. Download the [OS-HELP Academic Credit Approval Form](#) and ensure that it is completed and signed by your Faculty or School before you access the online form.
2. The OS-HELP Academic Credit Approval Form is submitted with the online OS-HELP Debt Confirmation Form to complete the application process.
3. To access the Debt Confirmation Form, log in to myUNSW > Student Profile > Commonwealth Government Forms.
4. You'll receive an email from the Student Financials team confirming receipt, within five working days of submitting your application.
